JOINT STIPULATION OF CLASS ACTION AND PAGA SETTLEMENT AND RELEASE

This Joint Stipulation of Class Action and PAGA Settlement and Release (“Settlement” or “Settlement Agreement”) is made and entered into by and between Plaintiffs Ramona Flores and Isabella Welch (“Plaintiffs” or “Class Representatives”), as individuals and on behalf of all others similarly situated, and Defendant North County Health Project Incorporated (“Defendant”) (collectively with Plaintiffs, the “Parties”).

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions are applicable to this Settlement Agreement. Definitions contained elsewhere in this Settlement Agreement will also be effective:

1. “Action” means *Flores, et al. v. North County Health Project*, No. 37-2020-00031419-CU-OE-CTL (San Diego County Superior Court).

2. “Attorneys’ Fees and Costs” means attorneys’ fees approved by the Court for Class Counsel’s litigation and resolution of the Action, and all out-of-pocket costs incurred and to be incurred by Class Counsel in the Action, including but not limited to expert/consultant fees, investigation costs, and costs associated with documenting the Settlement, providing any notices required as part of the Settlement or Court order, securing the Court’s approval of the Settlement, administering the Settlement, and obtaining entry of a Judgment terminating the Action. Class Counsel will request attorneys’ fees not in excess of one-third (1/3) of the Gross Settlement Amount, or Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000). The Attorneys’ Fees and Costs will also mean and include the additional reimbursement of any costs and expenses associated with Class Counsel’s litigation and settlement of the Action, up to Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), subject to the Court’s approval. Defendant has agreed not to oppose Class Counsel’s request for fees and reimbursement of costs as set forth above.

3. “Class Counsel” means Capstone Law APC.

4. “Class List” means a complete list of all Class Members that Defendant will diligently and in good faith compile from its records and provide to the Settlement Administrator and Class Counsel within twenty (20) calendar days after Preliminary Approval of this Settlement. The Class List will be formatted in Microsoft Office Excel and will include each Class Member’s full name; most recent mailing address and telephone number; Social Security number; dates of employment; the

1 respective number of Workweeks that each Class Member worked during the Class Period and PAGA
2 Period; and any other relevant information needed to calculate settlement payments.

3 5. "Class Member(s)" or "Settlement Class" means all persons who were employed by
4 Defendant as non-exempt, hourly paid employees in the State of California at any time during the Class
5 Period that did not execute an arbitration agreement with Defendant.

6 6. "Class Notice" means the Notice of Class Action Settlement, substantially in the form
7 attached as Exhibit A.

8 7. "Class Period" means the period from February 27, 2016 through May 27, 2025.

9 8. "Class Representative Enhancement Payments" means the amounts to be paid to
10 Plaintiffs in recognition of their effort and work in prosecuting the Action on behalf of Class Members,
11 and for their general release of claims. Subject to the Court granting final approval of this Settlement
12 Agreement and subject to the exhaustion of any and all appeals, Plaintiffs will request Court approval of
13 Class Representative Enhancement Payments of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), each.

14 9. "Court" means the San Diego County Superior Court.

15 10. "Defendant" means Defendant North County Health Project Incorporated.

16 11. "Effective Date" means the later of: (a) if no timely objections are filed, or are
17 withdrawn prior to Final Approval, then the date of Final Approval; or (b) if a Class Member files an
18 objection to the Settlement, the Effective Date shall be the sixty-first (61st) calendar day after the date of
19 Final Approval, provided no appeal is initiated by an objector; or (c) if a timely appeal is initiated by an
20 objector, then the Effective Date will be the date of final resolution of that appeal (including any requests
21 for rehearing and/or petitions for certiorari), resulting in final judicial approval of the Settlement.

22 12. "Final Approval" means the date on which the Court enters an order granting final
23 approval of the Settlement Agreement.

24 13. "Gross Settlement Amount" means the Gross Settlement Amount of One Million Five
25 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000), to be paid by Defendant in full satisfaction of all Released
26 Class Claims and Released PAGA Claims, which includes all Individual Settlement Payments,
27 Attorneys' Fees and Costs, the Class Representative Enhancement Payments, the PAGA Settlement
28 Amount, and Settlement Administration Costs. This Gross Settlement Amount has been agreed to by

1 Plaintiffs and Defendant based on the aggregation of the agreed-upon settlement value of individual
2 claims. In no event will Defendant be liable for more than the Gross Settlement Amount except as
3 otherwise explicitly set forth herein. There will be no reversion of the Gross Settlement Amount to
4 Defendant. Defendant will be separately responsible for any employer payroll taxes required by law,
5 including the employer FICA, FUTA, and SDI contributions, which shall not be paid from the Gross
6 Settlement Amount.

7 14. "Individual Settlement Payment" means each Participating Class Member's and PAGA
8 Member's respective shares of the Net Settlement Fund and PAGA Fund.

9 15. "Net Settlement Fund" means the portion of the Gross Settlement Amount remaining
10 after deducting the Attorneys' Fees and Costs, the Class Representative Enhancement Payments, the
11 PAGA Settlement Amount, and Settlement Administration Costs. The Net Settlement Fund will be
12 distributed to Participating Class Members. There will be no reversion of the Net Settlement Fund to
13 Defendant.

14 16. "Notice of Objection" means a Class Member's valid and timely written objection to the
15 Settlement Agreement. For the Notice of Objection to be valid, it must include: (a) the objector's full
16 name, signature, address, and telephone number, (b) a written statement of all grounds for the objection
17 accompanied by any legal support for such objection; (c) copies of any papers, briefs, or other
18 documents upon which the objection is based; and (d) a statement whether the objector intends to appear
19 at the final fairness hearing.

20 17. "PAGA Members" means all persons who were employed by Defendant as non-
21 exempt, hourly paid employees in the State of California at any time during the PAGA Period.

22 18. "PAGA Period" means the period from February 27, 2019 through May 27, 2025.

23 19. "PAGA Settlement Amount" means the amount that the Parties have agreed to pay to
24 the Labor and Workforce Development Agency ("LWDA") and PAGA Members in connection with
25 Plaintiffs' claim under the Labor Code Private Attorneys General Act of 2004 (Cal. Lab. Code §§ 2698,
26 *et seq.*, "PAGA") ("PAGA Settlement"). The Parties have agreed that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
27 (\$200,000) of the Gross Settlement Amount will be allocated to the PAGA Settlement. Pursuant to
28 PAGA, Seventy-Five Percent (75%), or One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000), of the PAGA

1 Settlement Amount will be paid to the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency (“Labor
2 and Workforce Development Agency Payment”), and Twenty-Five Percent (25%), or Fifty Thousand
3 Dollars (\$50,000) (“PAGA Fund”), of the PAGA Settlement will be disbursed to PAGA Members, and
4 regardless whether they request to be excluded from the Settlement Class.

5 20. “Parties” means Plaintiffs and Defendant collectively.

6 21. “Participating Class Members” means all Class Members who do not submit timely and
7 valid Requests for Exclusion.

8 22. “Plaintiffs” means Plaintiffs Ramona Flores and Isabella Welch.

9 23. “Preliminary Approval” means the date on which the Court enters an order granting
10 preliminary approval of the Settlement Agreement.

11 24. “Released Class Claims” means all claims, rights, demands, liabilities, and causes of
12 action that are alleged in the operative Complaint, or which could have been alleged by reason of, or in
13 connection with, any matter or fact set forth or referred to in the operative Complaint, including claims
14 for violation of: (1) California Labor Code §§ 510 and 1198 (unpaid overtime); (2) California Labor
15 Code §§ 1182.12, 1194, 1197, 1197.1, and 1198 (unpaid minimum wages); (3) California Labor Code
16 §§ 226.7, 512(a), 516, and 1198 (failure to provide meal periods); (4) California Labor Code §§ 226.7,
17 516, and 1198 (failure to authorize and permit rest periods); (5) California Labor Code §§ 226(a),
18 1174(d), and 1198 (non-compliant wage statements and failure to maintain payroll records); (6)
19 California Labor Code §§ 201 and 202 (wages not timely paid upon termination); (7) California Labor
20 Code § 204 (failure to timely pay wages during employment); (8) California Business & Professions
21 Code §§ 17200, *et seq.* (unlawful business practices); and (9) California Business & Professions Code §§
22 17200, *et seq.* (unfair business practices).

23 25. “Released PAGA Claims” means all claims for civil penalties under California Labor
24 Code §§ 2698, *et seq.*, that were brought or could reasonably have been brought based on the same facts
25 alleged in Plaintiffs’ LWDA letters and/or the operative Complaint during the PAGA Period.

26 26. “Released Parties” means Defendant, its past or present officers, directors, shareholders,
27 agents, principals, heirs, representatives, accountants, auditors, consultants, insurers and reinsurers, and
28 its respective successors and predecessors in interest, subsidiaries, affiliates, parents and attorneys, if any.

1 27. “Request for Exclusion” means a timely letter submitted by a Class Member indicating a
2 request to be excluded from the Settlement Class. The Request for Exclusion must: (a) set forth the
3 name, address, telephone number and last four digits of the Social Security Number of the Class
4 Member requesting exclusion; (b) be signed by the Class Member; (c) be returned to the Settlement
5 Administrator; (d) clearly state that the Class Member does not wish to be included in the Settlement;
6 and (e) be faxed or postmarked on or before the Response Deadline.

7 28. “Response Deadline” means the deadline by which Class Members must postmark or
8 fax to the Settlement Administrator Requests for Exclusion, postmark or fax disputes concerning the
9 calculation of Individual Settlement Payments, or postmark Notices of Objection to the Settlement
10 Administrator. The Response Deadline will be forty-five (45) calendar days from the initial mailing of
11 the Class Notice by the Settlement Administrator, unless the forty-fifth (45th) calendar day falls on a
12 Sunday or State holiday, in which case the Response Deadline will be extended to the next day on which
13 the U.S. Postal Service is open.

14 29. “Settlement Administration Costs” means the costs payable from the Gross Settlement
15 Amount to the Settlement Administrator for administering this Settlement, including, but not limited to,
16 printing, distributing, and tracking documents for this Settlement, tax reporting, distributing the Gross
17 Settlement Amount, and providing necessary reports and declarations, as requested by the Parties. The
18 Settlement Administration Costs will be paid from the Gross Settlement Amount, including, if necessary,
19 any such costs in excess of the amount represented by the Settlement Administrator as being the
20 maximum costs necessary to administer the Settlement. Based on an estimated Settlement Class of
21 approximately Four Hundred Fifty (450) Class Members, the Settlement Administration Costs are
22 currently estimated to be Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500).

23 30. “Settlement Administrator” means Phoenix Settlement Administrators, or any other
24 third-party class action settlement administrator agreed to by the Parties and approved by the Court for
25 the purposes of administering this Settlement. The Parties each represent that they do not have any
26 financial interest in the Settlement Administrator or otherwise have a relationship with the Settlement
27 Administrator that could create a conflict of interest.

28 31. “Workweeks” means the number of days of employment for each Class Member during

the Class Period, dividing by seven (7), and rounding up to the nearest whole number. All Class Members will be credited with at least one Workweek during the Class Period, and all PAGA Members will be credited with at least one Workweek during the PAGA Period.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

The Plaintiffs, on behalf of themselves and the Settlement Class, and Defendant agree as follows:

32. Funding of the Gross Settlement Amount. Defendant will make a one-time deposit of the Gross Settlement Amount of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) into a Qualified Settlement Account to be established by the Settlement Administrator. Defendant will pay the employer's share of payroll taxes separately. After the Effective Date, the Gross Settlement Amount will be used for: (a) Individual Settlement Payments; (b) the Labor and Workforce Development Agency Payment; (c) the Class Representative Enhancement Payments; (d) Attorneys' Fees and Costs; and (e) Settlement Administration Costs. Defendant will deposit the Gross Settlement Amount and the employer's share of payroll taxes within thirty (30) calendar days of the Effective Date ("Funding Date").

33. Attorneys' Fees and Costs. Defendant agrees not to oppose or impede any application or motion for attorneys' fees and costs by Class Counsel for Attorneys' Fees and Costs of not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000), plus the reimbursement of all out-of-pocket costs and expenses associated with Class Counsel's litigation and settlement of the Action (including expert/consultant fees, investigations costs, etc.), not to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), both of which will be paid from the Gross Settlement Amount.

34. Class Representative Enhancement Payments. In exchange for a general release, and in recognition of their effort and work in prosecuting the Action on behalf of Class Members, Defendant agrees not to oppose or impede any application or motion for Class Representative Enhancement Payments of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to each Plaintiff. The Class Representative Enhancement Payments will be paid from the Gross Settlement Amount and will be in addition to Plaintiffs' Individual Settlement Payment paid pursuant to the Settlement. Plaintiffs will be solely and legally responsible to pay any and all applicable taxes on the Class Representative Enhancement

1 Payments. Plaintiffs understand and agree that this Settlement Agreement shall remain in full force and
2 effect even if the full amount of Class Representative Enhancement Payments sought by Plaintiffs is not
3 ultimately awarded by the Court.

4 35. Settlement Administration Costs. The Settlement Administrator will be paid for the
5 reasonable costs of administration of the Settlement and distribution of payments from the Gross
6 Settlement Amount, which is currently estimated to be Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500).
7 These costs, which will be paid from the Gross Settlement Amount, will include, *inter alia*, the required
8 tax reporting on the Individual Settlement Payments, the issuing of 1099 and W-2 IRS Forms,
9 distributing Class Notices, calculating and distributing the Gross Settlement Amount, and providing
10 necessary reports and declarations.

11 36. PAGA Settlement Amount. Subject to Court approval, the Parties agree that the amount
12 of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) from the Gross Settlement Amount will be designated for
13 satisfaction of Plaintiffs' PAGA claim. Pursuant to PAGA, Seventy-Five Percent (75%), or One
14 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000), of this sum will be paid to the LWDA and Twenty-Five
15 Percent (25%), or Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), will be paid to PAGA Members in proportion to
16 the number of Workweeks worked during the PAGA Period.

17 37. No Right to Exclusion or Objections to the PAGA Settlement. Because this settlement
18 resolves claims and actions brought pursuant to PAGA by Plaintiffs acting as proxies and as Private
19 Attorneys General of, and for, the State of California and the LWDA, the Parties agree that no PAGA
20 Member has the right to exclude himself or herself from the release of the Released PAGA Claims, and
21 all PAGA Members will receive their shares of the PAGA Fund. The Parties also agree that no PAGA
22 Member has the right to object to the PAGA Settlement Amount.

23 38. Net Settlement Fund. The entire Net Settlement Fund will be distributed to Participating
24 Class Members. No portion of the Net Settlement Fund will revert to or be retained by Defendant.

25 39. PAGA Fund. The entire PAGA Fund will be distributed to all PAGA Members. No
26 portion of the PAGA Fund will revert to or be retained by Defendant.

27 40. Individual Settlement Payment Calculations. Individual Settlement Payments will be
28 calculated and apportioned from the Net Settlement Fund and PAGA Fund based on the number of

1 Workweeks a Class Member worked during the Class Period and PAGA Period. Specific calculations of
2 Individual Settlement Payments will be made as follows:

3 40(a) Payments from the Net Settlement Fund. Defendant will calculate the total
4 number of Workweeks worked by each Class Member during the Class
5 Period and the aggregate total number of Workweeks worked by all Class
6 Members during the Class Period. To determine each Class Member's
7 estimated "Individual Settlement Payment" from the Net Settlement Fund,
8 the Settlement Administrator will use the following formula: The Net
9 Settlement Fund will be divided by the aggregate total number of
10 Workweeks during the Class Period, resulting in the "Workweek Value."
11 Each Class Member's "Individual Settlement Payment" will be calculated
12 by multiplying each individual Class Member's total number of Workweeks
13 by the Workweek Value. The Individual Settlement Payment will be
14 reduced by any required deductions for each Participating Class Member as
15 specifically set forth herein, including employee-side tax withholdings or
16 deductions. The entire Net Settlement Fund will be disbursed to all Class
17 Members who do not submit timely and valid Requests for Exclusion. If
18 there are any valid and timely Requests for Exclusion, the Settlement
19 Administrator shall proportionately increase the Individual Settlement
20 Payment for each Participating Class Member according to the number of
21 Workweeks worked, so that the amount actually distributed to the
22 Settlement Class equals 100% of the Net Settlement Fund.

23 40(b) Payments from the PAGA Fund. Defendant will calculate the total number
24 of Workweeks worked by each PAGA Member during the PAGA Period
25 and the aggregate total number of Workweeks worked by all PAGA
26 Members during the PAGA Period. To determine each PAGA Member's
27 estimated "Individual Settlement Payment," the Settlement Administrator
28 will use the following formula: The PAGA Fund will be divided by the

1 aggregate total number of Workweeks during the PAGA Period, resulting in
2 the “PAGA Workweek Value.” Each PAGA Member’s “Individual
3 Settlement Payment” will be calculated by multiplying each individual
4 PAGA Member’s total number of Workweeks by the PAGA Workweek
5 Value. The entire PAGA Fund will be disbursed to all PAGA Members.

6 41. No Credit Toward Benefit Plans. The Individual Settlement Payments made to
7 Participating Class Members under this Settlement, as well as any other payments made pursuant to this
8 Settlement, will not be utilized to calculate any additional benefits under any benefit plans to which any
9 Class Members may be eligible, including, but not limited to profit-sharing plans, bonus plans, 401(k)
10 plans, stock purchase plans, vacation plans, sick leave plans, PTO plans, and any other benefit plan.
11 Rather, it is the Parties’ intention that this Settlement Agreement will not affect any rights, contributions,
12 or amounts to which any Class Members may be entitled under any benefit plans.

13 42. Administration Process. The Parties agree to cooperate in the administration of the
14 settlement and to make all reasonable efforts to control and minimize the costs and expenses incurred in
15 administration of the Settlement.

16 43. Delivery of the Class List. Within twenty (20) calendar days of Preliminary Approval,
17 Defendant will provide the Class List to the Settlement Administrator..

18 44. Notice by First-Class U.S. Mail. Within ten (10) calendar days after receiving the Class
19 List from Defendant, the Settlement Administrator will mail a Class Notice to all Class Members via
20 regular First-Class U.S. Mail, using the most current, known mailing addresses identified in the Class
21 List.

22 45. Confirmation of Updated Contact Information in the Class Lists. Prior to mailing, the
23 Settlement Administrator will perform a search based on the National Change of Address Database for
24 information to update and correct for any known or identifiable address changes. Any Class Notices
25 returned to the Settlement Administrator as non-deliverable on or before the Response Deadline will,
26 within five (5) business days of receipt, be sent promptly via regular First-Class U.S. Mail to the
27 forwarding address affixed thereto and the Settlement Administrator will indicate the date of such re-
28 mailing on the Class Notice. If no forwarding address is provided, the Settlement Administrator will

1 promptly attempt to determine the correct address using a skip-trace, or other search using the name,
2 address and/or Social Security Number of the Class Member involved, and will then perform a single re-
3 mailing. Those Class Members who receive a re-mailed Class Notice, whether by skip-trace or by
4 request, will have either (a) an additional fifteen (15) calendar days or (b) until the Response Deadline,
5 whichever is later, to submit a Request for Exclusion or an objection to the Settlement.

6 46. Class Notices. All Class Members will be mailed a Class Notice. Each Class Notice will
7 provide: (a) information regarding the nature of the Action; (b) a summary of the Settlement's principal
8 terms; (c) the Settlement Class and PAGA Member definitions; (d) the total number of Workweeks each
9 respective Class Member and PAGA Member worked for Defendant during the Class Period and PAGA
10 Period; (e) each Class Member's and PAGA Member's estimated Individual Settlement Payment and
11 the formula for calculating Individual Settlement Payments; (f) the dates which comprise the Class
12 Period and PAGA Period; (g) instructions on how to submit Requests for Exclusion or Notices of
13 Objection; (h) the deadlines by which the Class Member must postmark or fax Request for Exclusions,
14 or postmark Notices of Objection to the Settlement; and (i) the claims to be released.

15 47. Disputed Information on Class Notices. Class Members will have an opportunity to
16 dispute the information provided in their Class Notices. To the extent Class Members dispute their
17 employment dates or the number of Workweeks on record, Class Members may produce evidence to the
18 Settlement Administrator showing that such information is inaccurate. Defendant's records will be
19 presumed correct, but the Settlement Administrator shall contact the Parties regarding the dispute and the
20 Parties will work in good faith to resolve it. All disputes must be submitted by the Response Deadline,
21 and will be decided within ten (10) business days after the Response Deadline.

22 48. Defective Submissions. If a Class Member's Request for Exclusion is defective as to the
23 requirements listed herein, that Class Member will be given an opportunity to cure the defect(s). The
24 Settlement Administrator will mail the Class Member a cure letter within three (3) business days of
25 receiving the defective submission to advise the Class Member that his/her/their submission is defective
26 and that the defect must be cured to render the Request for Exclusion valid. The Class Member will have
27 until (a) the Response Deadline or (b) fifteen (15) calendar days from the date of the cure letter,
28 whichever date is later, to postmark or fax a revised Request for Exclusion. If the revised Request for

1 Exclusion is not postmarked or received by fax within that period, it will be deemed untimely.

2 49. Request for Exclusion Procedures. Any Class Member wishing to opt-out from the
3 Settlement Agreement must sign and fax or postmark a written Request for Exclusion to the Settlement
4 Administrator within the Response Deadline. In the case of Requests for Exclusion that are mailed to the
5 Settlement Administrator, the postmark date will be the exclusive means to determine whether a Request
6 for Exclusion has been timely submitted.

7 50. Escalator. Defendant represents that as of March 1, 2025, Class Members worked an
8 aggregate total of approximately Sixty-Seven Thousand One Hundred Seventeen (67,117) Workweeks
9 during the Class Period. If the actual aggregate total of Workweeks worked during the Class Period is
10 greater than Five Percent (5%) of this estimate, then Defendant must either: (a) increase the Gross
11 Settlement Amount proportionately for each Workweek above the Five Percent (5%) allowance (e.g., if
12 the total number of Workweeks increases by 6%, the Gross Settlement Amount will increase by 1%); or
13 (b) advance the end date of the Class Period and PAGA Period to the last date on which the total number
14 of Workweeks worked by Class Members in aggregate during the Class Period is no greater than Sixty-
15 Seven Thousand One Hundred Seventeen (67,117).

16 51. Settlement Terms Bind All Class Members Who Do Not Opt-Out. Any Class Member
17 who does not affirmatively opt-out of the Settlement Agreement by submitting a timely and valid
18 Request for Exclusion will be bound by all of its terms, including those pertaining to the Released Class
19 Claims, as well as any Judgment that may be entered by the Court if it grants final approval to the
20 Settlement.

21 52. Releases by Participating Class Members. Upon the Funding Date, and except as to such
22 rights or claims as may be created by this Settlement Agreement, each Participating Class Member,
23 together and individually, on their behalf and on behalf of their respective heirs, executors,
24 administrators, agents, and attorneys, shall fully and forever release and discharge all of the Released
25 Parties, or any of them, from each of the Released Class Claims arising during the Class Period.

26 53. Releases by PAGA Members. Upon the Funding Date, and except as to such rights or
27 claims as may be created by this Settlement Agreement, each PAGA Member, together and individually,
28 on their behalf and on behalf of their respective heirs, executors, administrators, agents, and attorneys,

1 shall fully and forever release and discharge all of the Released Parties, or any of them, from each of the
2 Released PAGA Claims during the PAGA Period.

3 54. Objection Procedures. To object to the Settlement Agreement, a Class Member may
4 either postmark a valid Notice of Objection to the Settlement Administrator on or before the Response
5 Deadline, or appear in person at the Final Approval Hearing. Class Members who fail to object either by
6 submitting a valid Notice of Objection or appearing in person at the Final Approval Hearing will be
7 deemed to have waived all objections to the Settlement and will be foreclosed from making any
8 objections, whether by appeal or otherwise, to the Settlement Agreement. At no time will any of the
9 Parties or their counsel seek to solicit or otherwise encourage Class Members to submit written
10 objections to the Settlement Agreement or appeal from the final approval order and judgment. Class
11 Counsel will not represent any Class Members with respect to any such objections to this Settlement. If a
12 Class Member timely submits both a Notice of Objection and a Request for Exclusion, the Request for
13 Exclusion will be given effect and considered valid, the Notice of Objection shall be rejected, and the
14 Class Member shall not participate in or be bound by the Settlement.

15 55. Certification Reports Regarding Individual Settlement Payment Calculations. The
16 Settlement Administrator will provide Defendant's counsel and Class Counsel a weekly report that
17 certifies the number of Class Members who have submitted valid Requests for Exclusion or objections to
18 the Settlement, and whether any Class Member has submitted a challenge to any information contained
19 in their Class Notice, including those received after the Response Deadline. Additionally, the Settlement
20 Administrator will provide to counsel for both Parties any updated reports regarding the administration
21 of the Settlement Agreement as needed or requested.

22 56. Distribution Timing of Individual Settlement Payments. Within ten (10) calendar days
23 of the Funding Date, the Settlement Administrator will issue payments to: (a) Participating Class
24 Members and PAGA Members; (b) the Labor and Workforce Development Agency; (c) Plaintiffs; and
25 (d) Class Counsel. The Settlement Administrator will also issue a payment to itself for Court-approved
26 services performed in connection with the Settlement.

27 57. Un-cashed Settlement Checks. Funds represented by Individual Settlement Payment
28 checks returned as undeliverable and Individual Settlement Payment checks remaining un-cashed for

1 more than one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days after issuance will be tendered to the State
2 Controller's Office, Unclaimed Property Division in the name of each Class Member who did not
3 negotiate his or her check, thereby leaving no "unpaid residue" subject to the requirements of California
4 Code of Civil Procedure Section 384, subd. (b).

5 58. Certification of Completion. Upon completion of administration of the Settlement, the
6 Settlement Administrator will provide a written declaration under oath to certify such completion to the
7 Court and counsel for all Parties.

8 59. Treatment of Individual Settlement Payments. All Individual Settlement Payments will
9 be allocated as follows: (a) Twenty Percent (20%) of each Individual Settlement Payment will be
10 allocated as wages for which IRS Forms W-2 will be issued; and (b) Eighty Percent (80%) will be
11 allocated as non-wages for which IRS Forms 1099-MISC will be issued. Payments issued to PAGA
12 Members from the PAGA Fund will be treated as non-wages for which IRS Forms 1099-MISC will be
13 issued.

14 60. Administration of Taxes by the Settlement Administrator. The Settlement Administrator
15 will be responsible for issuing to Plaintiffs, Participating Class Members, PAGA Members, and Class
16 Counsel any W-2, 1099, or other tax forms as may be required by law for all amounts paid pursuant to
17 this Settlement. The Settlement Administrator will also be responsible for forwarding all payroll taxes
18 and penalties to the appropriate government authorities.

19 61. Tax Liability. The Parties make no representation as to the tax treatment or legal effect
20 of the payments called for hereunder, and Plaintiffs, Participating Class Members, and PAGA Members
21 are not relying on any statement, representation, or calculation by Defendant or by the Settlement
22 Administrator in this regard.

23 62. Circular 230 Disclaimer. EACH PARTY TO THIS AGREEMENT (FOR PURPOSES
24 OF THIS SECTION, THE "ACKNOWLEDGING PARTY" AND EACH PARTY TO THIS
25 AGREEMENT OTHER THAN THE ACKNOWLEDGING PARTY, AN "OTHER PARTY")
26 ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT (1) NO PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT, AND
27 NO WRITTEN COMMUNICATION OR DISCLOSURE BETWEEN OR AMONG THE PARTIES
28 OR THEIR ATTORNEYS AND OTHER ADVISERS, IS OR WAS INTENDED TO BE, NOR

1 WILL ANY SUCH COMMUNICATION OR DISCLOSURE CONSTITUTE OR BE CONSTRUED
2 OR BE RELIED UPON AS, TAX ADVICE WITHIN THE MEANING OF UNITED STATES
3 TREASURY DEPARTMENT CIRCULAR 230 (31 CFR PART 10, AS AMENDED); (2) THE

22 64. Nullification of Settlement Agreement. In the event that: (a) the Court does not finally
23 approve the Settlement as provided herein; or (b) the Settlement does not become final for any other
24 reason, then this Settlement Agreement, and any documents generated to bring it into effect, will be null
25 and void. Any order or judgment entered by the Court in furtherance of this Settlement Agreement will
26 likewise be treated as void from the beginning.

27 65. Preliminary Approval Hearing. Plaintiffs will obtain a hearing before the Court to
28 request the Preliminary Approval of the Settlement Agreement, and the entry of a Preliminary Approval

1 Order for: (a) conditional certification of the Settlement Class for settlement purposes only, (b)
2 preliminary approval of the proposed Settlement Agreement, (c) setting a date for a final fairness
3 hearing. The Preliminary Approval Order will provide for the Class Notice to be sent to all Class
4 Members as specified herein. In conjunction with the Preliminary Approval hearing, Plaintiffs will
5 submit this Settlement Agreement, which sets forth the terms of this Settlement, and will include the
6 proposed Notice of Class Action Settlement, attached as Exhibit A. Class Counsel will be responsible for

8 66. Final Settlement Approval Hearing and Entry of Judgment. Upon expiration of the
9 deadlines to postmark Requests for Exclusion or objections to the Settlement Agreement, and with the
10 Court's permission, a final fairness hearing will be conducted to determine the Final Approval of the
11 Settlement Agreement along with the amounts properly payable for: (a) Attorneys' Fees and Costs; (b)
12 the Class Representative Enhancement Payments; (c) Individual Settlement Payments; (d) the Labor and
13 Workforce Development Agency Payment; (e) all Settlement Administration Costs. Class Counsel will
14 be responsible for drafting all documents necessary to obtain final approval. Class Counsel will also be
15 responsible for drafting the attorneys' fees and costs application to be heard at the final approval hearing.

16 67. Judgment and Continued Jurisdiction. Upon final approval of the Settlement by the
17 Court or after the final fairness hearing, the Parties will present the Judgment to the Court for its
18 approval. After entry of the Judgment, the Court will have continuing jurisdiction solely for purposes of
19 addressing: (a) the interpretation and enforcement of the terms of the Settlement, (b) Settlement
20 administration matters, and (c) such post-Judgment matters as may be appropriate under court rules or as
21 set forth in this Settlement Agreement. A copy of the Judgment will be posted to the Settlement
22 Administrator's website.

23 68. Release by Plaintiffs. Upon the Funding Date, in addition to the claims being released by
24 all Participating Class Members, Plaintiffs will release and forever discharge the Released Parties, to the
25 fullest extent permitted by law, of and from any and all claims, known and unknown, asserted and not
26 asserted, which Plaintiffs have or may have against the Released Parties as of the date of execution of
27 this Settlement Agreement. To the extent the foregoing release is a release to which Section 1542 of the
28 California Civil Code or similar provisions of other applicable law may apply, Plaintiffs expressly waive

any and all rights and benefits conferred upon them by the provisions of Section 1542 of the California Civil Code or similar provisions of applicable law which are as follows:

A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS THAT THE CREDITOR OR RELEASING PARTY DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE AND THAT, IF KNOWN BY HIM OR HER, WOULD HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR OR RELEASED PARTY.

69. Exhibits Incorporated by Reference. The terms of this Settlement Agreement include the terms set forth in any attached Exhibits, which are incorporated by this reference as though fully set forth herein. Any Exhibits to this Settlement Agreement are an integral part of the Settlement.

70. Entire Agreement. This Settlement Agreement and any attached Exhibits constitute the entirety of the Parties' settlement terms. No other prior or contemporaneous written or oral agreements may be deemed binding on the Parties. The Parties expressly recognize California Civil Code Section 1625 and California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1856(a), which provide that a written agreement is to be construed according to its terms and may not be varied or contradicted by extrinsic evidence, and the Parties agree that no such extrinsic oral or written representations or terms will modify, vary or contradict the terms of this Settlement Agreement.

71. Amendment or Modification. No amendment, change, or modification to this Settlement Agreement will be valid unless in writing and signed, either by the Parties or their counsel, and approved by the Court.

72. Authorization to Enter Into Settlement Agreement. Counsel for all Parties warrant and represent they are expressly authorized by the Parties whom they represent to negotiate this Settlement Agreement and to take all appropriate action required or permitted to be taken by such Parties pursuant to this Settlement Agreement to effectuate its terms and to execute any other documents required to effectuate the terms of this Settlement Agreement. The Parties and their counsel will cooperate with each other and use their best efforts to effect the implementation of the Settlement. If the Parties are unable to reach agreement on the form or content of any document needed to implement the Settlement, or on any

supplemental provisions that may become necessary to effectuate the terms of this Settlement, the Parties may seek the assistance of the Court to resolve such disagreement.

73. Binding on Successors and Assigns. This Settlement Agreement will be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the successors or assigns of the Parties hereto, as previously defined.

74. California Law Governs. All terms of this Settlement Agreement and Exhibits hereto will be governed by and interpreted according to the laws of the State of California.

75. Execution and Counterparts. This Settlement Agreement is subject only to the execution of all Parties. However, the Settlement Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts. All executed counterparts and each of them, including electronic (e.g., DocuSign), facsimile, and scanned copies of the signature page, will be deemed to be one and the same instrument.

76. Acknowledgement that the Settlement is Fair and Reasonable. The Parties believe this Settlement Agreement is a fair, adequate and reasonable settlement of the Action and have arrived at this Settlement after arm's-length negotiations and in the context of adversarial litigation, taking into account all relevant factors, present and potential. The Parties further acknowledge that they are each represented by competent counsel and that they have had an opportunity to consult with their counsel regarding the fairness and reasonableness of this Settlement.

77. Invalidity of Any Provision. Before declaring any provision of this Settlement Agreement invalid, the Court will first attempt to construe the provision as valid to the fullest extent possible consistent with applicable precedents so as to define all provisions of this Settlement Agreement valid and enforceable.

78. Waiver of Certain Appeals. The Parties agree to waive appeals and to stipulate to class certification for purposes of this Settlement only; except, however, that Plaintiffs or Class Counsel may appeal any reduction to the Attorneys' Fees and Costs below the amount they request from the Court, and either party may appeal any court order that materially alters the Settlement Agreement's terms.

79. Class Action Certification for Settlement Purposes Only. The Parties agree to stipulate to class action certification for purposes of the Settlement only. If, for any reason, the Settlement is not approved, the stipulation to certification will be void. The Parties further agree that certification for purposes of the Settlement is not an admission that class action certification is proper under the standards

1 applied to contested certification motions and that this Settlement Agreement will not be admissible in
2 this or any other proceeding as evidence that either (a) a class action should be certified or (b) Defendant
3 is liable to Plaintiffs or any Class Member, other than according to the Settlement's terms.

4 80. Non-Admission of Liability. The Parties enter into this Settlement to resolve the dispute
5 that has arisen between them and to avoid the burden, expense and risk of continued litigation. In
6 entering into this Settlement, Defendant does not admit, and specifically denies, that it violated any
7 federal, state, or local law; violated any regulations or guidelines promulgated pursuant to any statute or

20 82. Waiver. No waiver of any condition or covenant contained in this Settlement Agreement
21 or failure to exercise a right or remedy by any of the Parties hereto will be considered to imply or
22 constitute a further waiver by such party of the same or any other condition, covenant, right or remedy.

23 83. Enforcement Actions. In the event that one or more of the Parties institutes any legal
24 action or other proceeding against any other Party or Parties to enforce the provisions of this Settlement
25 or to declare rights and/or obligations under this Settlement, the successful Party or Parties will be
26 entitled to recover from the unsuccessful Party or Parties reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, including
27 expert witness fees incurred in connection with any enforcement actions.

28 84. Mutual Preparation. The Parties have had a full opportunity to negotiate the terms and

conditions of this Settlement Agreement. Accordingly, this Settlement Agreement will not be construed more strictly against one party than another merely by virtue of the fact that it may have been prepared by counsel for one of the Parties, it being recognized that, because of the arms'-length negotiations between the Parties, all Parties have contributed to the preparation of this Settlement Agreement.

85. Representation By Counsel. The Parties acknowledge that they have been represented by counsel throughout all negotiations that preceded the execution of this Settlement Agreement, and that this Settlement Agreement has been executed with the consent and advice of counsel. Further, Plaintiffs and Class Counsel warrant and represent that there are no liens on the Settlement Agreement.

86. All Terms Subject to Final Court Approval. All amounts and procedures described in this Settlement Agreement herein will be subject to final Court approval.

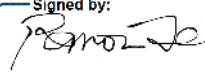

All persons who were employed by Defendant as non-exempt, hourly paid employees in the State of California at any time during the period from February 27, 2019 through May 27, 2025 (“PAGA Members”).

On _____, the Honorable Blaine K. Bowman of the San Diego County Superior Court granted preliminary approval of this class action settlement and ordered the litigants to notify all Class Members of the settlement. **You have received this notice because Defendant’s records indicate that you are a Class Member, and therefore entitled to a payment from the settlement.**

Unless you choose to opt out of the settlement by following the procedures described below, you will be deemed a Class Member and, if the Court grants final approval of the settlement, you will be mailed a check for your share of the settlement fund. Summary of the Litigation

Plaintiffs Ramona Flores and Isabella Welch, on their behalf and on behalf of other current and former non-exempt employees, allege that Defendant violated California state labor laws as a result of its alleged failure to, among other things: (1) pay minimum and overtime wages to employees for all hours worked; (2) provide employees with meal and rest breaks; (3) timely pay all wages owed to employees during each pay period and upon termination of their employment; and (4) provide employees with accurate, itemized wage statements.

After the exchange of relevant information and evidence, the parties agreed to enter into settlement negotiations in an attempt to informally resolve the claims in the case. On February 27, 2025, the parties participated in a mediation with the Hon. Eddie C. Sturgeon (Ret.), an experienced and well-respected mediator. With Judge Sturgeon’s guidance, the parties were able to negotiate a complete settlement of Plaintiffs’ claims.

Counsel for Plaintiffs, and the attorneys appointed by the Court to represent the class, Capstone Law APC (“Class Counsel”), have investigated and researched the facts and circumstances underlying the issues raised in the case and the applicable law. While Class Counsel believe that the claims alleged in this lawsuit have merit, Class Counsel also recognize that the risk and expense of continued litigation justify settlement. Based on the foregoing, Class Counsel believe the proposed settlement is fair, adequate, reasonable, and in the best interests of Class Members.

Defendant has denied, and continues to deny the factual and legal allegations in the case and believes that it has valid defenses to Plaintiffs’ claims. By agreeing to settle, Defendant is not admitting liability on any of the factual allegations or claims in the case or that the case can or should proceed as a class action. Defendant has agreed to settle the case as part of a compromise with Plaintiffs.

Summary of The Proposed Settlement Terms

Plaintiffs and Defendant have agreed to settle the underlying class claims in exchange for a Gross Settlement Amount of \$1,500,000. Settlement Class (“Net Settlement Fund”). Additionally, all PAGA Members will receive a proportional share of the \$50,000 PAGA Fund, regardless of whether they opt out of the Settlement Class.

Payments from Net Settlement Fund. Defendant will calculate the total number of Workweeks worked by each Class Member from February 27, 2016 through May 27, 2025 (“Class Period”) and the aggregate total number of Workweeks worked by all Class Members during the Class Period. To determine each Class Member’s estimated share of the Net Settlement Fund, the Settlement Administrator will use the following formula: The Net Settlement Fund will be divided by the aggregate total number of Workweeks during the Class Period, resulting in the “Workweek Value.” Each Class Member’s share of the Net Settlement Fund will be calculated by multiplying each individual Class Member’s total number of Workweeks by the Workweek Value. Taxes on Settlement Payments. IRS Forms W-2 and 1099 will be distributed to participating Class Members and the appropriate taxing authorities reflecting the payments they receive under the settlement. Class Members should consult their tax advisors concerning the tax consequences of the payments they receive under the Settlement. For purposes of this settlement, 20% of each settlement payment will be allocated as wages for which IRS Forms W-2 will be issued, and 80% will be allocated as non-wages for which IRS Forms 1099-MISC will be issued. Payments issued to PAGA Members from the PAGA Fund will be treated as non-wages for which IRS Forms 1099-MISC will be issued.

Your Options Under the Settlement

Option 1 – *Automatically Receive a Payment from the Settlement*

If want to receive your payment from the settlement, then no further action is required on your part. You will automatically receive your settlement payment from the Settlement Administrator if and when the Settlement receives final approval by the Court.

If you choose **Option 1**, and if the Court grants final approval of the settlement, you will be mailed a check for your share of the settlement funds. In addition, on the date on which Defendant fully funds the Gross Settlement Amount, you will be deemed to have released or waived the Released Class Claims, and if you are also a PAGA Member, the Released PAGA Claims:

Released Class Claims: All claims, rights, demands, liabilities, and causes of action that are alleged in the operative Complaint, or which could have been alleged by reason of, or in connection with, any matter or fact set forth or referred to in the operative Complaint, including claims for violation of: (1) California Labor Code §§ 510 and 1198 (unpaid overtime); (2) California Labor Code §§ 1182.12, 1194, 1197, 1197.1, and 1198 (unpaid minimum wages); (3) California Labor Code §§ 226.7, 512(a), 516, and 1198 (failure to provide meal periods); (4) California Labor Code §§ 226.7, 516, and 1198 (failure to authorize and permit rest periods); (5) California Labor Code §§ 226(a), 1174(d), and 1198 (non-compliant wage statements and failure to maintain payroll records); (6) California Labor Code §§ 201 and 202 (wages not timely paid upon termination); (7) California Labor Code § 204 (failure to timely pay wages during employment); (8) California Business & Professions Code §§ 17200, *et seq.* (unlawful business practices); and (9) California Business & Professions Code §§ 17200, *et seq.* (unfair business practices).

Released PAGA Claims: All claims for civil penalties under California Labor Code §§ 2698, *et seq.*, that were brought or could reasonably have been brought based on the same facts alleged in Plaintiffs' LWDA letters and/or the operative Complaint during the PAGA Period.

Option 2 – *Opt Out of the Settlement*

If you do not wish to participate in the settlement, you may exclude yourself from participating by submitting a written request to the Settlement Administrator expressly and clearly indicating that you have received this Notice of Class Action Settlement, decided not to participate in the settlement, and desire to be excluded from the settlement. The written request for exclusion must include your name, signature, address, telephone number, and last four digits of your Social Security Number. Option 3 – *Object to the Settlement*

If you decide to object to the settlement because you find it unfair or unreasonable, you may submit a written objection stating why you object to the settlement, or you may instead appear at the Final Approval Hearing to object to the

Settlement. Written objections must provide: (1) your full name, signature, address, and telephone number, (2) a written statement of all grounds for the objection accompanied by any legal support for such objection; (3) copies of any papers, briefs, or other documents upon which the objection is based; and (4) a statement about whether you intend to appear at the Fairness Hearing. The objection must be mailed to the administrator at [administrator's address].

All written objections must be received by the administrator by not later than _____ 2026. By submitting an objection, you are not excluding yourself from the settlement. To exclude yourself from the settlement, you must follow the directions described above. Please note that you cannot both object to the settlement and exclude yourself. You must choose one option only.
