1 This matter has come before the Honorable Timothy Taylor in Department C-72 of the above-
2 entitled Court, located at 330 West Broadway, San Diego, California 92101, on Plaintiff Joseph
3 Ocasio's ("Plaintiff") Motion for Final Approval of Class Action Settlement ("Motion for Final
4 Approval") and Motion for Attorneys' Fees and Costs, and Enhancement Payment ("Motion for
5 Fees"). Lawyers *for* Justice, PC appeared on behalf of Plaintiff, and GBG LLP appeared on behalf of
6 Defendants The Goodman Group, LLC and Monte Vista Lodge Limited Partnership (erroneously
7 named as "Monte Vista Lodge, LP" and "Monte Vista Village") (together, "Defendants").

8 On December 2, 2022, the Court entered the Order Granting Preliminary Approval of Class
9 Action Settlement ("Preliminary Approval Order"), thereby preliminarily approving the settlement of
10 the above-entitled action ("Action") in accordance with the Joint Stipulation of Class Action and
11 PAGA Settlement ("Settlement," "Agreement," or "Settlement Agreement"), which, together with
12 the exhibits annexed thereto, set forth the terms and conditions for settlement of the Action.

13 Having reviewed the Settlement Agreement and duly considered the parties' papers and oral
14 argument, and good cause appearing,

15 **THE COURT HEREBY ORDERS, ADJUDGES, AND DECREES AS FOLLOWS:**

16 1. All terms used herein shall have the same meaning as defined in the Settlement
17 Agreement and the Preliminary Approval Order.

18 2. This Court has jurisdiction over the claims of the Class Members asserted in this
19 proceeding and over all parties to the Action.

20 3. The Court finds that the Enhancement Payment sought is fair and reasonable for the
21 work performed by Plaintiff on behalf of the Class, the State of California, and the PAGA Group
22 Members. It is hereby ordered that the Settlement Administrator issue payment in the amount of
23 \$7,500.00 to Plaintiff Joseph Ocasio for his Enhancement Payment, according to the terms and
24 methodology set forth in the Settlement Agreement.

25 4. The Court finds that the request for attorneys' fees in the amount of \$420,000.00 to
26 Class Counsel falls within the range of reasonableness, and the results achieved justify the award
27 sought. The requested attorneys' fees to Class Counsel are fair, reasonable, and appropriate, and are
28 hereby approved. It is hereby ordered that the Settlement Administrator issue payment in the amount

1 of \$420,000.00 to Class Counsel for attorneys' fees, in accordance with the terms and methodology
2 set forth in the Settlement Agreement.

3 5. The Court finds that reimbursement of litigation costs and expenses in the amount of
4 \$18,406.38 to Class Counsel is reasonable, and hereby approved. It is hereby ordered that the
5 Settlement Administrator issue payment in the amount of \$18,406.38 to Class Counsel for
6 reimbursement of litigation costs and expenses, in accordance with the terms and methodology set
7 forth in the Settlement Agreement.

8 6. After entry of this Order, pursuant to California Rules of Court, Rule 3.769(h), the
9 Court shall retain jurisdiction to construe, interpret, implement, and enforce the Settlement
10 Agreement and this Order, to hear and resolve any contested challenge to a claim for settlement
11 benefits, and to supervise and adjudicate any dispute arising from or in connection with the
12 distribution of settlement benefits.

13 7. Notice of entry of this Order shall be given to the Participating Settlement Class
14 Members and PAGA Group Members by posting a copy of the Order on the Settlement
15 Administrator's website for a period of at least sixty (60) calendar days after the date of entry of this
16 Order. Individualized notice is not required.
