The Joint Stipulation Requesting Approval of Individual PAGA Settlement and Dismissal of Plaintiff's Individual PAGA Claim *With Prejudice* and Dismissal of PAGA Claims of Aggrieved Employees Other Than Those of Plaintiff, and the State of California *Without Prejudice*, having come before the Court, and the Court having considered the Stipulation, the Individual PAGA Settlement Agreement attached thereto as **Exhibit 1**, and the entire record in this action, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Court approves the Parties' Individual PAGA Settlement Agreement pursuant to California Labor Code section 2699(k), finding that the settlement of Plaintiff's individual PAGA claim is fair, adequate, and reasonable in light of the purposes of PAGA and the State of California's interest in enforcement of the Labor Code;

2. Plaintiff's individual PAGA claims asserted in this Action are hereby dismissed *with prejudice*;

3. Plaintiff's representative PAGA claims asserted on behalf of other allegedly aggrieved employees and the State of California are hereby dismissed *without prejudice*;

4. The Court finds that the allocation of PAGA penalties set forth in the Individual PAGA Settlement Agreement complies with California Labor Code section 2699(i), including payment of the LWDA's statutory share;

5. Each Party shall bear its own attorneys' fees and costs; and

6. The Court shall retain continuing jurisdiction over this Action and the Parties for the purpose of enforcing, interpreting, and implementing the Individual PAGA Settlement Agreement and the Joint Stipulation.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
