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I, John G. Yslas, declare as follows:

1. I am an attorney at law licensed to practice before all of the courts of the State of California. I am a Senior Partner at Wilshire Law Firm, PLC (“WLF”), counsel of record for Plaintiff Tabuyo Maria Tabuyo (“Plaintiff Tabuyo Tabuyo”). I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration and could and would competently testify to them under oath if called as a witness.

2. I submit this declaration in support of Plaintiffs' Motion for Final Approval of Class Action and PAGA Settlement.

3. Plaintiff Tabuyo is represented by WLF. The attorneys at WLF performed significant work and expended litigation costs in prosecuting this matter with no guarantee of payment.

4. WLF was selected by Best Lawyers and U.S. News & World Report as one of the nation's Best Law Firms since 2020 and is comprised of more than 100 attorneys and over 600 employees. WLF is actively and continuously practicing in employment litigation, representing employees in both individual and class actions in both state and federal courts throughout California.

5. WLF is qualified to handle this Litigation because its attorneys are experienced in litigating Labor Code violations in individual, class action, and representative action cases. WLF has handled, and is currently handling, numerous wage and hour class action lawsuits, as well as class actions involving consumer rights and data privacy litigation.

6. I graduated from the University of California, Santa Barbara with High Honors in 1991 with Bachelor of Arts degrees in Psychology. I received my Juris Doctor from UCLA Law School in 1996.

7. Upon graduating from law school in 1996, I worked for a boutique law firm practicing general litigation which included employment law matters. Since 2000 (that is, the last 25 years) my practice has been exclusively focused on labor and employment matters

1 including handling wage and hour class, collective and representative actions (including the
2 California Private Attorneys General Act, or “PAGA”), including in the international law firms
3 of Morgan, Lewis & Bockius LLP (where I was a senior associate), Foley & Lardner LLP (where
4 I was a partner and a national Vice Chair of the Labor and Employment Group), Norton Rose
5 Fulbright LLP (where I was a partner) and Seyfarth Shaw LLP (where I was a partner and
6 member of the Wage and Hour Practice Group). During my time at these law firms, I was the
7 primary attorney or took a major leading role in defending employers on numerous wage and
8 hour class, collective and representative actions.

9 8. In late June 2022 I left Seyfarth Shaw LLP and joined my current firm, Wilshire
10 Law Firm, PLC, to represent plaintiff employees. I have been and am handling many wage and
11 hour class and representative actions litigating such matters on behalf of plaintiff employees in
12 numerous Superior Courts and District Courts. From matters representing both plaintiffs and
13 defendants, I have successfully mediated the resolution of many wage and hour class, collective,
14 and representative actions. Just since starting to settle cases in late April 2023 I have already
15 successfully mediated matters in which I have been counsel or co-counsel resulting in **over \$185**
16 **million** in settlements and verdicts which are in the process of being finalized, and with
17 numerous upcoming mediations scheduled. In those and numerous other matters, I have managed
18 and assisted with the litigation and settlement of many wage and hour PAGA and class actions.
19 In those actions, I performed similar tasks as those performed in the course of prosecuting this
20 action. Indeed, I recently tried and prevailed in achieving a jury verdict in a wage and hour class
21 action in the matter of Aguilar-Flores v. Javier’s – CC LLC, Los Angeles County Superior Court,
22 Case No. 19STCV36438 (ultimate resolution pending).

23 9. I have received numerous awards for my legal work. For example, from 2015 to
24 2018, I was listed in Los Angeles Super Lawyers for Employment Litigation (Thomson Reuters).
25 I have also served on numerous prominent boards and in other leadership positions, including
26 serving as Southern California Regional President for the Hispanic National Bar Association and
27 on the board of directors of the Mexican American Bar Foundation. I also previously served on
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1 the 5-member Los Angeles Civil Service Commission, which generally oversees the personnel
2 decisions for the City of Los Angeles.

3 10. I have also published numerous blogs on labor and employment issues including
4 on wage and hour issues. For example, I published “Headline News: Wal-Mart v. Dukes-Impact
5 on Class Action Litigation” (while a partner with Foley & Lardner LLP) and “Are You Really
6 Protected From Wage-and-Hour Successor Liability in an Asset Purchase” (while a partner with
7 Seyfarth Shaw LLP). I have also been a presenter at numerous conferences, including being a
8 presenter involving the “Employment Law Update” at a National Employment Law Council
9 conference. The rate I have been using since the outset of our case is \$850.00.

10 11. Jeffrey C. Bills is an eleventh-year Senior Attorney at WLF. He graduated from
11 the University of Wisconsin–Madison with a Bachelor of Arts in Journalism and German, and
12 received his Juris Doctor from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Law in 2014.
13 During law school, he was a Senior Editor on the UCLA Law Review and an Articles Editor on
14 the Entertainment Law Review. He served as a Judicial Extern for the Hon. Consuelo Bland
15 Marshall in United States District Court for the Central District of California, and also for the
16 Hon. Sandra R. Klein of United States Bankruptcy Court for the Central District of California.
17 He graduated ranked No. 7 in his graduating class from UCLA School of Law. He was admitted
18 to practice law in the State of California in 2014. Since graduating from law school, he has
19 focused his legal work primarily on employment matters, including wage-and-hour class action
20 and PAGA representative action litigation, and he has helped obtain dozens of settlements on
21 behalf California workers, as well as on behalf of California employers during his years on the
22 defense bar. He is a member of the Beverly Hills Bar Association (BHBA), where he serves as
23 a current member of the Board of Governors and is a past Chair of the Labor & Employment
24 Law Section Executive Committee. He is also a member of the California Employment Lawyers
25 Association (CELA). The rate Mr. Bills has been using since the outset of our case is \$650.00.

26 12. Aram Boyadjian is a fifth-year Associate Attorney at WLF. He was admitted to
27 practice law in the State of California in 2021. Aram graduated from the University of California,
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1 Los Angeles, with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He received his Juris Doctor from
2 Loyola Law School. During law school, he was a member of the student editorial board for the
3 International and Comparative Law Review. Since January 2021, his practice has mainly been
4 focused on wage and hour class action litigation. The rate Mr. Boyadjian has been using since
5 the outset of our case is \$550.00.

6 13. Andrew Sandoval is a third-year Associate Attorney at WLF. He was admitted to
7 practice law in the State of California in 2022. Andrew graduated from Azusa Pacific University
8 with a Bachelor of Arts in Economics. He received his Juris Doctor from Loyola Law School.
9 During law school, he was a Vice-President of La Raza de Loyola. Since graduating, his practice
10 has mainly been focused on wage and hour class action litigation. The rate Mr. Sandoval has
11 been using since the outset of our case is \$450.00.

12 14. Emily Borman (“Ms. Borman”) is a Junior Partner at Wilshire Law Firm, PLC.
13 She was admitted to practice law in the State of California in May 2015. Ms. Borman graduated
14 from Cornell University with a Bachelor of Science in Development Sociology and a Minor in
15 Applied Economics and Management. While at Cornell she was inducted into the Alpha Kappa
16 Delta International Honor Society. Ms. Borman received her Juris Doctor from University of
17 California Law San Francisco (formerly UC Hastings). Since graduating, her practice has been
18 in employment law, including plaintiff-side wage and hour cases. She has received numerous
19 awards for her legal work. In 2021 and from 2023 to 2025, Super Lawyers selected her as a
20 “Southern California Rising Star. The rate Ms. Borman has been using is \$800.00.

21 15. WLF’s hourly rates are comparable to those charged by other class action
22 plaintiffs’ counsel and the firms defending class actions. WLF’s hourly rates have been approved
23 by other courts in California in which WLF was approved as Class Counsel. *See, e.g., Matthew*

SGPS Showrig Los Angeles, Inc.*, Los Angeles County Superior Court, Case No. 22STCV28155; *Azevedo v. The total hours expended on this action are reasonable and in line with comparable cases.

16. WLF has performed significant work and incurred litigation costs in prosecuting this matter with no guarantee of any payment. The efforts expended by Plaintiffs' counsel to achieve this result include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a. the investigation of the matter, including meeting with Plaintiff Tabuyo, evaluating Defendant's practices, and requesting and evaluating related information;
- b. filing the Actions;
- c. attending status conferences and meeting and conferring with Defendant regarding the case;
- d. meeting and conferring with Defendant regarding mediation, evaluating

information pertaining to the mediation and engaging in related tasks;

- e. evaluating exposure rates;
- f. analyzing practices and researching applicable defenses;
- g. preparation of a mediation brief ;
- h. attendance at the second mediation by all Parties and Counsel;
- i. communicating with Plaintiff Tabuyo who requested updates or other information regarding this matter;
- j. finalizing and fully executing the settlement agreement;
- k. providing input on the Motion for Preliminary Approval and supporting documents;
- l. attending the hearings on Motion for Preliminary Approval;
- m. and
- n. preparing the instant Motion for Final Approval and supporting documents.

17. WLF's lodestar reflects the efficiencies achieved by attorneys experienced in this field with **207.7** hours of work resulting in **\$140,535.00** in fees. WLF dedicated significant resources to this case by dividing the tasks required according to skill level. The hours expended by each attorney were not duplicative and reflect the extensive investigation and analysis that was required to achieve this Settlement. This amount does not include the time Class Counsel will spend at the final approval hearing and assisting the Settlement Administrator following final approval. The chart below shows the calculation of hours spent by each of WLF's attorneys on this case:

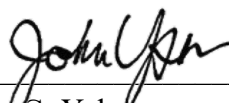

18. Class Counsel has singularly assumed the risk and costs of litigation purely on a contingency basis. And, while Plaintiff Tabuyo is confident in the merits of her claims, a legitimate controversy exists as to each cause of action posing an actual risk that Plaintiff Tabuyo may not succeed at class certification and/or trial. Any of these obstacles could have prevented recovery completely, meaning Class Counsel would have been left with no compensation for all the time and money invested in litigating this case. Despite these risks, Class Counsel took this case on a contingency basis so that Class Members (a particularly vulnerable group of hourly paid workers) could be compensated for their unpaid wages. Consequently, Class Counsel was precluded from focusing on, or taking on, other cases which could have resulted in a larger, and less risky, monetary gain. This time could have been spent on other potentially lucrative cases.

19. In litigation costs, WLF has spent \$11,101.32 on items such as filing fees, service fees, mediation fees, and expert fees. A true and correct copies of WLF's cost reports in this matter are attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**. All of the costs incurred were reasonable and necessary for the prosecution of this case.

20. Class Counsel has negotiated a settlement here that they believe is fair, reasonable, and adequate based on their prior experience litigating these type of cases.
