I, Misty M. Lauby, state and declare:

1. I am an attorney licensed to practice before all of the courts of the State of California. I am a partner at Lauby, Mankin & Lauby LLP. I represent the Plaintiff Briana Arreola in this action and I am thoroughly familiar with and have personal knowledge of all of the facts set forth herein. I submit this declaration in support of Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Approval of Class Action Settlement. If called as a witness, I could and would competently testify thereto.

2. For the sake of brevity, this declaration does not discuss the settlement itself, the procedural background of the litigation, the claims and investigation by my firm and why the settlement is fair and reasonable. Those topics are covered in detail in the concurrently filed Declaration of Brian Mankin. This declaration simply provides information requested by the court as to why I am adequate class counsel.

COUNSEL'S EXPERIENCE

3. I have been a member, in good standing, of the State Bar of California since 2006. I am licensed to practice before all courts of the State of California and am admitted to practice in the United States District Court for the Central District of California and have litigated cases in various courts and counties throughout California.

4. I began working as an attorney for Fernandez & Lauby, LLP (now Lauby, Mankin & Lauby, LLP) in 2006. From 2006 through March 2018, I worked in the firm's insurance defense department as the handling attorney in approximately 250-350 complex construction defect litigation matters that I successfully managed and settled on behalf of multiple insurance carrier and contractor clients.

5. In or around March 2018, I transitioned to handling exclusively employee vs. employer litigation matters.

6. Leading up to the transition and continuing through the present, I have taken seriously the responsibility of acquiring expertise in the field by participating in numerous continuing legal education seminars specific to the representation of employees in litigated matters, mediation, and complex litigation, including the following non-exhaustive list: California Employment Lawyers Association (“CELA”) Wage & Hour Boot Camp in September 2016; CELA 13th Annual Advanced Wage and Hour Seminar in May 2017; CELA 30th Annual Employment Law Conference in October 2017; Castle Publications and SheppardMullin Wage and Hour Laws in March 2018; Bridgeport PAGA Claims 2018 Seminar in March 2018; California Lawyers Association Labor & Employment Law Section 35th Labor & Employment Law Annual Meeting April 2018; Bridgeport Class Action Litigation Conference Seminar in April 2018; Los Angeles County Bar Association 2018 Complex Court Symposium in November

13 7. The vast majority of my employment cases have been litigated as class actions,
14 representative PAGA actions or a combination of the two.

15 8. I have been the handling attorney on over 45 class action and/or representative
16 PAGA actions. And, on these cases, myself and/or my firm have been appointed Class Counsel
17 on over 27 cases, and have helped recover over \$20,000,000 for my clients, the employees, and
18 the State of California.

19 9. I have been involved in one contested class certification motion in a case that
20 settled just prior to the class certification hearing.

21 10. Attached as **Exhibit A** is a list of 27 resolved and/or settlement class actions,
22 collective actions, and/or PAGA actions that I have handled in the last 5.5 years (note: this list
23 excludes currently active cases and settlements pending approval).

24 **HOURLY RATE**

25 11. My billing rate is \$650 per hour, and this rate is usual and customary for class
26 action and/or PAGA practitioners with my level of expertise and experience.

27 12. This rate is consistent with Plaintiff and Defense attorneys who handle complex
28 class action litigation, if not somewhat lower. For instance, the 2023 Wolters Kluwer Real rate

1 Report (“Real Rate Report”) states that the rates for partners in Los Angeles are between \$840
2 and \$1,159 for the middle and upper quartiles.

3 13. Importantly, the Real Rate Report data is not based on self-reported numbers,
4 surveys, or sampling – instead, these figures are based on an analysis of the actual amounts billed
5 to clients based on more than 160 billion in billing entries.

6 14. My requested rate is also reasonable, consistent and less than the rate found in the
7 Laffey Matrix (www.laffeymatrix.com), which indicates that the benchmark rate for an attorney
8 that graduated law school in 2006 is \$878.

9 15. My hourly rate has been approved by various courts in California, including the

27 have successfully resolved at least 27 of those cases, with many others still pending that will
28 resolve in the future.

1 17. For these reasons, as well as the facts and information presented in the
2 concurrently filed Declaration of Brian J. Mankin, it is respectfully requested that the Court: (1)
3 grant preliminary approval of the settlement as being fair, reasonable, and in the best interests of
4 the class, (2) appoint Plaintiffs as the Class Representatives, and (3) appoint Brian J. Mankin and
5 Misty M. Lauby of Lauby, Mankin & Lauby LLP as Class Counsel,

6 I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the
7 foregoing is true and correct. Executed on September 13, 2024, at Claremont, California.

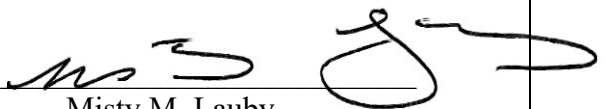
