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I, Paul K. Haines, declare as follows:

1. I am a shareholder and principal of the law firm Haines Law Group, APC and counsel for the named plaintiff Quentece Boone (“Plaintiff”) in the above-captioned matter. I am a member in good standing of the bar of the State of California and am admitted to practice in this Court. I have personal knowledge of the facts stated in this declaration and could testify competently to them if called upon to do so.

2. I am a 2006 graduate of Pepperdine University School of Law, where I graduated *cum laude*. During law school, I worked as a law clerk for the appellate firm of Horvitz & Levy, located in Encino, California. I also spent a semester in law school working as an extern for the Honorable Edward Rafeedie, District Judge for the United States District Court for the Central District of California.

3. Since graduating from law school, my practice focused almost exclusively on employment litigation. In September 2007, I began working as an associate attorney at the international law firm of Littler Mendelson P.C., at its Los Angeles office, which according to its website is the “largest U.S.-based law firm exclusively devoted to representing management in every aspect of labor and employment law.” While at Littler Mendelson, I was primarily staffed on wage and hour class actions in both state and federal courts, and I also worked on a number of single and multi-plaintiff wage and hour matters as well.

4. During my employment at Littler Mendelson, I played a significant role in the class actions that I was staffed on, as I was often the only associate staffed on such cases. In particular, I received a wide array of wage and hour class action experience performing the following types of tasks: drafting demurrers and motions to strike and/or dismiss; removing actions from state court to federal court; drafting and responding to written discovery; drafting and opposing discovery related motions; arguing discovery related motions; drafting motions to consolidate related matters; interviewing putative class members and obtaining declarations in connection with class certification; drafting oppositions to motions for class certification; drafting motions for decertification following class certification; conducting exposure analyses

1 to assess the strengths and weaknesses of asserted claims, the likelihood of prevailing at class
2 certification, and potential damages resulting from such claims; drafting mediation briefs;
3 serving as the primary contact to in-house counsel; deposing named plaintiffs and putative class
4 members; deposing retained expert witnesses; and defending the depositions of corporate
5 witnesses. In short, I played an integral role in all aspects of litigation from the inception of a
6 matter through and beyond class certification. I also supervised the work of several junior
7 attorneys who were staffed on the same wage and hour class actions.

8 5. In June 2011, I voluntarily resigned from Littler Mendelson in order to accept an
9 associate attorney position with the international law firm of Morgan, Lewis & Bockius LLP, at
10 its Los Angeles office, where I began working in July 2011. During my employment at Morgan,
11 Lewis & Bockius, I worked exclusively on the defense of wage and hour class and collective
12 actions. For the majority of cases that I worked on, I was the only associate staffed on the case,
13 and I performed the same job duties as described in the immediately preceding paragraph. In
14 addition to working on wage and hour class actions, at Morgan, Lewis & Bockius I also worked
15 on a number of “hybrid” actions asserting nationwide wage and hour claims under the Fair Labor
16 Standards Act, as well as California-specific claims under Rule 23 of the Rules of Civil
17 Procedure.

18 6. In July 2012, I transitioned into litigating wage and hour class actions from the
19 Plaintiff’s side, first as a Partner with the law firm of Boren, Osher & Luftman, LLP, and since
20 February 2016 as a Shareholder of Haines Law Group, APC. Currently, over ninety percent
21 (90%) of my practice is dedicated exclusively to the prosecution of wage and hour class actions,
22 and my law firm is currently responsible for prosecuting over fifty (50) wage and hour class
23 actions filed in both State and Federal courts throughout California. I have been appointed as
24 Class Counsel in over seventy-five (75) wage and hour class action settlements in state and
25 federal courts within California. A few examples of the matters in which I have been appointed

15 consulted for recommendations regarding wage and hour class action cases, including preparing
16 model class action and PAGA action settlement agreements which are now publicly available at
17 <http://www.lacourt.org/forms/all>.

18 9. In April 2019, I served as trial counsel for the Plaintiff in the matter of *Calhoun*
19 *v. Aqua Tech Water Management Inc.*, Case No. BS169815, Los Angeles County Superior Court,
20 Honorable Theresa M. Traber presiding, which was an individual wage-and-hour case that
21 resulted in a six-figure verdict in favor of Plaintiff. I was subsequently awarded attorney's fees
22 at my requested rate of \$650 per hour in 2020.

23 10. In March 2023, my firm served as trial counsel for the plaintiff and aggrieved
24 employees in the matter of *Abraham Taduran v. James R. Glidewell, Dental Ceramics, Inc. dba*
25 *Glidewell Laboratories*, Case No. 30-2017-00934037-CU-OE-CXC, Orange County Superior
26 Court, Honorable William Claster presiding, which was a case brought under the Private
27 Attorneys General Act, Labor Code §§ 2698 *et seq.*, and resulted in a six-figure verdict in favor
28 of the aggrieved employees.

11. In every year from 2015 through 2017, Thomson Reuters recognized me as a Top Young Attorney in Southern California in the annual Rising Stars Edition of Super Lawyer. This is an honor awarded to no more than two-and-a-half percent of attorneys under the age of forty in Southern California each year. In every year from 2018 through 2025, Thomson Reuters recognized me as a “Super Lawyer” in the annual Super Lawyer magazine, an honor awarded to no more than five percent of all attorneys in Southern California each year.

12. As counsel for Plaintiff, I have been closely involved in all aspects of this litigation since its inception. The details of the work completed by Class Counsel in this case are set forth in the declaration of Andrew J. Rowbotham, filed concurrently herewith.

13. I confirm that neither I nor my firm has any interest or involvement in, and that neither I nor my firm is affiliated with Apex Class Action LLC or Koinonia Family Services.

14. I am not aware of any other class, representative, or other collective actions in any other court or jurisdiction that assert claims similar to those asserted in this action on behalf of a class or group of individuals some or all of whom would also be members of the class defined in this action. I made a reasonable inquiry of other members of my law firm to determine whether anyone in my firm is aware of any such similar actions.
