**DECLARATION OF PLAINTIFF ANDY
K. FRANCO, JR. IN SUPPORT OF
MOTION FOR APPROVAL OF PAGA
SETTLEMENT**

1 I, Andy K. Franco, Jr., declare as follows:

2 1. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration and could and
3 would competently testify to them under oath if called as a witness. I submit this declaration in
4 support of my Motion for Approval of PAGA Settlement.

5 2. I worked as a non-exempt, hourly employee for the Defendant Golden Queen Mining
6 Company, LLC ("Defendant") in California, from approximately September 2020 through March
7 2023. I worked as a welder mechanic for Defendant. My responsibilities included, but not limited to,
8 welding, fabricating items, repairing equipment, and maintaining equipment, among other tasks.

9 **Risks, Both Financial and Otherwise, Faced in Bringing the Suit**

10 3. When I decided to become involved in this lawsuit as a private attorney general for
11 the State of California, I understood that I was not only seeking civil penalties on behalf of myself
12 and the State of California, but also for other aggrieved employees who worked for Defendant.

13 4. I was also made aware that being a private attorney general in an action filed on behalf
14 of others would subject me to a stigma that is sometimes associated with those who bring these kinds
15 of lawsuits. I was aware that, as a private attorney general, I might be responsible for some or all of
16 Defendant's legal costs if the case was not successfully concluded. Even with knowledge of these
17 risks, I was willing to go forward and to act on behalf of the other employees and the State of
18 California, but I was nervous about losing and having a judgment filed against me for costs or losing
19 job opportunities in the future.

20 5. I understood that there were risks involved in representative action lawsuits. I
21 understood that the lawsuit could continue for several years and require my services and attention
22 throughout the entire length of the lawsuit. I learned that even if we won at trial, the case could be
23 further delayed by appeals.

24 **Notoriety and Personal Difficulties Encountered**

25 6. As one of the named plaintiffs, I am the face of the litigation. Additionally, a
26 settlement letter will be mailed to over 330 current and former employees of Defendant. The
27 settlement letter informs all of these employees that I filed a representative action against Defendant.
28 Exposing myself to this kind of publicity creates a risk for my future career prospects, since current

1 and former employees of Defendant may move to different companies within the industry or may
2 know people at other companies within the industry who may not want to hire someone who sued an
3 employer.

4 **Amount of Time and Effort Spent and Duration of the Litigation**

5 7. I have spent a substantial amount of time and effort on this litigation. My work on
6 this case has included, among other things, gathering and providing my payroll records, discussing
7 potential witnesses, assisting my attorneys prepare for mediation, making myself available to my
8 attorneys whenever they needed me and similarly related tasks, and participating in settlement
9 discussions. After mediation, I remained actively involved by reviewing the settlement papers and
10 regularly contacted my counsel for updates. I estimate that since I retained my counsel, on or around
11 March 2023, I have spent at least approximately 35 hours on the activities described above.

12 **Personal Benefit Received as a Result of the Litigation**

13 8. Aside from the requested PAGA Representative Service Payment related to this
14 PAGA action, the personal benefit I will receive in this case is the same as all other employees. But
15 unlike the other employees, I have signed a broader release as explained in section 5.1 and 5.1.1 of
16 the agreement. The other employees are only releasing their claim for civil penalties under PAGA
17 as asserted in the lawsuit.

18 I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the
