DECLARATION OF JOHN G. YSLAS

I, John G. Yslas, declare as follows:

1. I am an attorney at law licensed to practice before all of the courts of the State of California. I am a Senior Partner at Wilshire Law Firm, PLC (“WLF”), counsel of record for Plaintiff John Margaritis, Jr. (“Plaintiff”). I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration and could and would competently testify to them under oath if called as a witness.

2. I submit this declaration in support of Plaintiff’s Motion for Final Approval of Class Action and PAGA Settlement.

3. Plaintiff is represented by WLF. The attorneys at WLF performed significant work and expended litigation costs in prosecuting this matter with no guarantee of payment.

4. WLF was selected by Best Lawyers and U.S. News & World Report as one of the nation’s Best Law Firms since 2020 and is comprised of more than 100 attorneys and over 600 employees. WLF is actively and continuously practicing in employment litigation, representing employees in both individual and class actions in both state and federal courts throughout California.

5. WLF is qualified to handle this Litigation because its attorneys are experienced in litigating Labor Code violations in individual, class action, and representative action cases. WLF has handled, and is currently handling, numerous wage and hour class action lawsuits, as well as class actions involving consumer rights and data privacy litigation.

6. I graduated from the University of California, Santa Barbara with High Honors in 1991 with Bachelor of Arts degrees in Psychology. I received my Juris Doctor from UCLA Law School in 1996.

7. Upon graduating from law school in 1996, I worked for a boutique law firm practicing general litigation which included employment law matters. Since 2000 (that is, the last 25 years) my practice has been exclusively focused on labor and employment matters including handling wage and hour class, collective and representative actions (including the

1 California Private Attorneys General Act, or “PAGA”), including in the international law firms
2 of Morgan, Lewis & Bockius LLP (where I was a senior associate), Foley & Lardner LLP
3 (where I was a partner and a national Vice Chair of the Labor and Employment Group), Norton
4 Rose Fulbright LLP (where I was a partner) and Seyfarth Shaw LLP (where I was a partner and
5 member of the Wage and Hour Practice Group). During my time at these law firms, I was the
6 primary attorney or took a major leading role in defending employers on numerous wage and
7 hour class, collective and representative actions.

8 8. In late June 2022 I left Seyfarth Shaw LLP and joined my current firm, Wilshire
9 Law Firm, PLC, to represent plaintiff employees. I have been and am handling many wage and
10 hour class and representative actions litigating such matters on behalf of plaintiff employees in
11 numerous Superior Courts and District Courts. From matters representing both plaintiffs and
12 defendants, I have successfully mediated the resolution of many wage and hour class,
13 collective, and representative actions. Just since starting to settle cases in late April 2023 I have
14 already successfully mediated matters in which I have been counsel or co-counsel resulting in
15 **more than \$190 million** in settlements and verdicts which are in the process of being finalized,
16 and with numerous upcoming mediations scheduled. In those and numerous other matters, I
17 have managed and assisted with the litigation and settlement of many wage and hour PAGA
18 and class actions. In those actions, I performed similar tasks as those performed in the course
19 of prosecuting this action. Indeed, I recently tried and prevailed in achieving a jury verdict in
20 a wage and hour class action in the matter of *Aguilar-Flores v. Javier’s – CC LLC*, Los Angeles
21 County Superior Court, Case No. 19STCV36438.

22 9. I have received numerous awards for my legal work. For example, from 2015 to
23 2018, I was listed in Los Angeles Super Lawyers for Employment Litigation (Thomson
24 Reuters). I have also served on numerous prominent boards and in other leadership positions,
25 including serving as Southern California Regional President for the Hispanic National Bar
26 Association and on the board of directors of the Mexican American Bar Foundation. I also
27 previously served on the 5-member Los Angeles Civil Service Commission, which generally
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1 oversees the personnel decisions for the City of Los Angeles.

2 10. I have also published numerous blogs on labor and employment issues including
3 on wage and hour issues. For example, I published “Headline News: Wal-Mart v. Dukes-
4 Impact on Class Action Litigation” (while a partner with Foley & Lardner LLP) and “Are You
5 Really Protected From Wage-and-Hour Successor Liability in an Asset Purchase” (while a
6 partner with Seyfarth Shaw LLP). I have also been a presenter at numerous conferences,
7 including being a presenter involving the “Employment Law Update” at a National
8 Employment Law Council conference. I currently bill at an hourly rate of \$1,500.00.

9 11. Samantha A. Smith was a Senior Attorney at WLF where her practice was
10 focused on managing wage and hour class action and PAGA settlements. Ms. Smith was
11 admitted to the California Bar in December of 2004, and received a J.D. from University of
12 California, Hastings College of the Law and a B.A. from University of California, Davis. Ms.
13 Smith has dedicated her 21-year career to plaintiffs’-side class action litigation. Her wealth of
14 experience includes successful work on all stages of class action litigation, including class
15 action appeals, class certification motions, and class settlements. See, e.g., *Blue Diamond*
16 *Growers Product Labeling Cases*, JCCP No. 4822 (Los Angeles County Superior Court) (false
17 advertising of Blue Diamond food products); *Adam vs. eHealth, Inc.*, Case No. 17CV309050
18 (Santa Clara County Superior Court) (employee data breach); *Overton v. Armour-Eckrich*
19 *Meats, LLC*, Case No. CIVDS1501325 (San Bernardino County Superior Court) (unpaid
20 wages, meal period and rest break claims, and PAGA violations for non-exempt employees);
21 *DeLeon et al. v. Westlake Services, LLC*, Case No. BC 526750 (Los Angeles County Superior
22 Court) (unpaid overtime, meal period and rest break claims for call center employees); *Sawyer*
23 *v. Retail Data, LLC*, Case No. 30-2014-00753767-CU-OE-CXC (Orange County Superior
24 Court) (unpaid wage and rest break claims for piece rate workers); *Nguyen v. Pharmerica*
25 *Corporation et al.*, Case No. 30-2014-00716072-CU-OE-CXC (Orange County Superior
26 Court) (unpaid wages and unreimbursed expenses for pharmacists); *Laumea v. Performance*
27 *Food Group, Inc.*, Case No. CIVDS1407509 (San Bernardino County Superior Court) (unpaid

5 and rest break claims for non-exempt employees). Ms. Smith billed at an hourly rate of
6 \$1,000.00.

7 12. Jeffrey C. Bils is an eleventh-year Senior Attorney at WLF. He graduated from
8 the University of Wisconsin–Madison with a Bachelor of Arts in Journalism and German, and
9 received his Juris Doctor from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Law in 2014.
10 During law school, he was a Senior Editor on the UCLA Law Review and an Articles Editor
11 on the Entertainment Law Review. Mr. Bils served as a Judicial Extern for the Hon. Consuelo
12 Bland Marshall in United States District Court for the Central District of California, and also
13 for the Hon. Sandra R. Klein of United States Bankruptcy Court for the Central District of
14 California. Mr. Bils graduated ranked No. 7 in his graduating class from UCLA School of Law.
15 He was admitted to practice law in the State of California in 2014. Since graduating from law
16 school, he has focused his legal work primarily on employment matters, including wage-and-
17 hour class action and PAGA representative action litigation, and he has helped obtain dozens
18 of settlements on behalf California workers, as well as on behalf of California employers during
19 his years on the defense bar. Mr. Bils is a member of the Beverly Hills Bar Association
20 (BHBA), where he is a past member of the Board of Governors and a past Chair of the Labor
21 & Employment Law Section Executive Committee. He is also a member of the California
22 Employment Lawyers Association (CELA) and the Consumer Attorneys Association of Los
23 Angeles (CAALA). Mr. Bils currently bills at an hourly rate of \$850.00.

24 13. Aram Boyadjian is a fifth-year Associate Attorney at WLF. He was admitted to
25 practice law in the State of California in 2021. Aram graduated from the University of
26 California, Los Angeles, with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He received his Juris
27 Doctor from Loyola Law School. During law school, he was a member of the student editorial
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1 board for the International and Comparative Law Review. Since January 2021, his practice has
2 mainly been focused on wage and hour class action litigation. Mr. Boyadjian currently bills at
3 an hourly rate of \$600.00.

4 14. Lisa B. Iturriaga is a Settlement Attorney at Wilshire Law Firm, PLC. She was
5 admitted to practice law in the State of California in 2021. Ms. Iturriaga graduated from
6 University of South Florida with a Bachelor of Science in Finance and a Bachelor of Arts in
7 Marketing. She received her Juris Doctor from Chapman University Dale E. Fowler School of
8 Law. Since graduating, her practice has been in insurance defense (previously) and
9 employment law (currently). Since 2023, she has exclusively worked on Plaintiff-side wage
10 and hour cases. Ms. Iturriaga is also a member of the California Employment Lawyers
11 Association (CELA). Ms. Iturriaga currently bills at an hourly rate of \$550.00.

12 15. Andrew Sandoval is a third-year Associate Attorney at WLF. He was admitted
13 to practice law in the State of California in 2022. Andrew graduated from Azusa Pacific
14 University with a Bachelor of Arts in Economics. He received his Juris Doctor from Loyola
15 Law School. During law school, he was a Vice-President of La Raza de Loyola. Since
16 graduating, his practice has mainly been focused on wage and hour class action litigation. Mr.
17 Sandoval currently bills at an hourly rate of \$500.00.

18 16. WLF's hourly rates are comparable to those charged by other class action
19 plaintiffs' counsel and the firms defending class actions. WLF's hourly rates have been
20 approved by other courts in California in which WLF was approved as Class Counsel. *See, e.g.,*

Northrop*, Central District of California, No. 2:23-cv-03756 PA (PDx). The total hours expended on this action are reasonable and in line with comparable cases.

17. WLF has performed significant work and incurred litigation costs in prosecuting this matter with no guarantee of any payment. The efforts expended by Plaintiffs' counsel to achieve this result include, but are not limited to, the following:

a. the investigation of the matter, including meeting with Plaintiff, reviewing Defendant's policies, and requesting and reviewing Plaintiff's time and pay records, personnel files, and exploring the corporate structure of Defendant;

b. filing the Actions;

c. attending status conferences and meeting and conferring with Defendant regarding the case;

d. meeting and conferring with Defendant regarding mediation, exchange of informal discovery beforehand, and negotiating with opposing counsel regarding the

parameters thereof;

e. selecting a mediator and mediation date;

f. working with opposing counsel and expert consultants for the receipt of a representative sampling and analyzing the same with the aid of expert consultants and Plaintiff to perform analyses of liability and exposure prior to attendance of the mediation in this matter;

g. reviewing policy documents from Defendant and researching applicable defenses;

h. preparation of the mediation brief and damages model for use at mediation;

i. attendance at the mediations by all Parties and Counsel;

j. communicating with Plaintiff who requested updates or other information regarding this matter;

k. reviewing mediator's proposal;

l. negotiating, finalizing and fully executing the memorandum of understanding;

m. negotiating, finalizing and fully executing the settlement agreement;

n. preparing and filing the Motion for Preliminary Approval and supporting documents;

o. attending the hearing on Motion for Preliminary Approval;

p. preparing and filing supplemental Motion for Preliminary Approval and supporting documents;

q. communicating with class members who sought additional information regarding the settlement, including answering questions regarding the settlement and obtaining updated addresses from class members for purposes of receiving the class notices and administering the settlement checks; and

r. preparing the instant Motion for Final Approval and supporting documents.

18. WLF's current lodestar reflects the efficiencies achieved by attorneys experienced in this field with **136.4 hours** of work resulting in **\$117,255.00** in fees. The chart below shows the calculation of hours spent by each of WLF's attorneys on this case:

19. This amount surpasses the requested fee award of \$84,000.00, resulting in a negative multiplier. This amount does not include the time Class Counsel will spend at the final approval hearing and assisting the Settlement Administrator following final approval. WLF dedicated significant resources to this case by dividing the tasks required according to skill level. The hours expended by each attorney were not duplicative and reflect the extensive investigation and analysis that was required to achieve this Settlement. This time could have been spent on other potentially lucrative cases. WLF's lodestar reflects the efficiencies achieved by attorneys experienced in this field.

20. In litigation costs, WLF has spent \$15,685.07 on items such as filing fees, service fees, mediation fees, and expert fees. Since Class Counsel's costs do not exceed the maximum of \$20,000.00, the remaining \$4,314.93 will revert to the Net Settlement Amount. A true and correct copies of WLF's cost reports in this matter are attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**. All of the costs incurred were reasonable and necessary for the prosecution of this case.

21. Class Counsel has negotiated a settlement here that they believe is fair, reasonable, and adequate based on their prior experience litigating these type of cases.

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1 22. To date, the LWDA has not responded to or objected to the Settlement in this
2 matter.

3 I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the

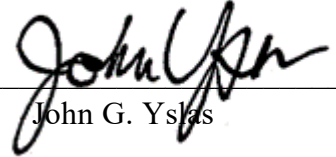
