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1 (“CELA”). I am one of its founding members and actively remain a member of its Reverse

13 Furthermore, my office has succeeded in certifying classes in contested motions for

26 14. Currently, my firm is acting as counsel in dozens of wage and hour class actions
27 and representative PAGA actions.

28 15. I believe that I am sufficiently experienced and qualified to evaluate the claims

1 alleged in this action and viability of Defendants' defenses.

2 16. Vedang J. Patel has been a member of my law firm for over three (3) years and
3 served as class counsel on numerous actions on which I was also named class counsel. Prior to
4 working with Bibiyan Law Group, P.C., he practiced law with Murchison & Cumming, LLP on a
5 variety of matter on behalf of defendants. Thereafter, he joined Bibiyan Law Group, P.C.,
6 practicing law on behalf of plaintiffs in matters of employment law, and specifically on issue of
7 unpaid wages and class action settlements. He is currently a Partner at Bibiyan Law Group, P.C.,
8 and head of the Settlement Department. Among other tasks, he oversees and manages all
9 settlements at Bibiyan Law Group, P.C. He also oversees several attorneys, paralegals, and legal
10 assistants and has overseen the settlement of over one hundred (100) class and PAGA matters
11 while with our office.

12 17. After a thorough investigation and settlement discussions, I arrived at terms that I
13 viewed was in the best interest of both Plaintiff and PAGA Members.

14 **Plaintiff's Counsel's Requested Fees and Costs are Reasonable**

15 18. I believe Plaintiff's Counsel is entitled to recover attorneys' fees and costs.
16 Plaintiffs request a fee of thirty-five percent (35%) of the Gross Settlement Amount, which, unless
17 and until escalated pursuant to the Parties' Settlement Agreement, amounts to \$240,000, is
18 reasonable, is well within the range of fees generally sought and approved in other class and
19 representative cases and is also reasonable based on Plaintiffs' Counsel's lodestar.

20 19. Plaintiffs' Counsel invested time and resources into litigating this Action, with over
21 \$26,363.833 of costs to date and counting deferred to the end of the case and entirely contingent
22 on the outcome which, as set forth above, the recovery of which was far from certain with much
23 of the litigation still potentially pending.

24 20. During the period that this Action has been pending, Plaintiffs' Counsel have
25 advanced all expenses, and has not received any compensation for prosecuting the Action on
26 behalf of the State and other Aggrieved Employees.

1 **The Requested Fees are Also Reasonable Under a Lodestar Crosscheck**

2 21. I understand from my position as principal of Bibiyan Law Group, P.C., my
3 involvement with the case, and information provided by my staff, that Bibiyan Law Group, P.C.,
4 will have collectively billed 330.7 hours at customary hourly rates.

5 22. To summarize Plaintiffs' Counsel's lodestar request, Plaintiffs' Counsel at Bibiyan
6 Law Group, P.C., will have collectively worked approximately 330.7 hours. Plaintiffs' Counsel's
7 hourly rate in this case for David D. Bibiyan is \$1,100 per hour (approx. 31.7 hours); Jeff Klein
8 is \$1000 per hour (approx. 4.8 hours); Diego Aviles is \$850 per hour (approx. 26.1 hours); Vedang
9 J. Patel is \$800 per hour (approx. 73.4 hours); Eric Naessig is \$525 per hour (approx. 8.2 hours);
10 Jasmin Aradi is \$500 per hour (approx.. 141.3 hours); Keaton Mendoza is \$450 per hour (approx.
11 17.2 hours); Paralegals are \$200 per hour (approx. 16.5 hours); and Legal Assistants are \$95 per
12 hour (approx. 11.5 hours). At Bibiyan Law Group, P.C.'s hourly rates, this results in a total
13 lodestar amount of \$207,663.

14 **Plaintiff's Counsel's Hours Spent on the Case**

15 23. After diligent inquiry of the members of my firm, I can attest that Bibiyan Law
16 Group, P.C., has spent over 330 hours litigating this Action to bring it to resolution, not including
17 time which will be expended monitoring the administration of the settlement and distribution of
18 funds to PAGA Members.

19 24. Plaintiff's Counsel at Bibiyan Law Group, P.C., has spent over 330 hours litigating
20 this Action to bring it to resolution, not including time which will be expended monitoring the
21 administration of the settlement and distribution of funds to Aggrieved Employees. The efforts
22 expended by Plaintiffs' Counsel to achieve this result include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 23 • The investigation of the matter, including meeting with Plaintiffs, reviewing policies
24 provided by Plaintiffs, review of documents in Plaintiffs' possession, review and
25 analysis of Plaintiffs' personnel files, and exploring Defendants' corporate structure
26 to determine whether any other individuals or entities should be named in the
27 litigation;

- 1 • Researching the dockets for other cases filed against Defendants, determining
2 whether they named all allegedly culpable defendants and included all theories
3 available;
- 4 • Filing and serving pleadings in the Actions;
- 5 • Compliance with prerequisites in connection with Plaintiffs' cause of action under
6 PAGA;
- 7 • Filing and serving of the PAGA Notice;
- 8 • Reviewing and analyzing Defendants' Answers to Plaintiffs' initial complaints;
- 9 • Review and analysis of the Court's Minute Orders, attention to scheduling and
10 delegation of actions in light thereof, drafting and filing Case Management
11 Statements, and preparation for appearance at the Case Management Conferences;
- 12 • Meeting and conferring with counsel for Defendants, drafting and filing Joint
13 Statements and Joint Reports in advance of the conferences and hearings held by the
14 Court, and preparation and attendance of the same;
- 15 • Review and analysis of Defendants' purported arbitration agreements, extensive
16 discussions with Defense counsel regarding enforceability of the arbitration
17 agreements, and negotiating, drafting, reviewing, and filing the Stipulation Re:
18 Arbitration;
- 19 • Obtaining and reviewing informal discovery from Defendants, including time and
20 payroll records for a sampling of the Aggrieved Employees, Defendants' written
21 policies, and other informal discovery produced for Plaintiffs to evaluate the claims;
- 22 • Drafting and propounding formal discovery consisting of Form Interrogatories,
23 Special Interrogatories, Requests for Admission and Requests for Production to
24 numerous defendants;
- 25 • Analyze and assess Defendants' responses and production in response to formal
26 discovery;
- 27 • Discussing the potential merits of mediation, as well as negotiating the parameters
28 thereof and the informal discovery to be exchanged beforehand, which involved

1 various iterations of written correspondence back and forth and several telephone
2 discussions between counsel regarding the potential scope of discovery, as well as
3 the scope of the pleadings;

- 4 • Negotiating, drafting, and executing pre-mediation joint stipulation which included
5 an agreement by Defendants to refrain from attempting to individually settle
6 employees' claims alleged in the Action;
- 7 • Working with opposing counsel and consultants for the receipt of a representative
8 sampling and analyzing the same with the aid of retained expert data consultants and
9 Plaintiffs to perform analyses of liability and exposure;
- 10 • Selecting a mediator and scheduling a mediation date;
- 11 • Preparation of mediation brief, analysis, and damages model in conjunction with
12 expert data consultants, for use at the mediation session;
- 13 • Attendance at a full-day mediation session by various attorneys;
- 14 • Drafting First Amended Complaint to include all allegations from the PAGA action
15 and Vargas PAGA action;
- 16 • Extensive negotiation of the PAGA Settlement Agreement involving numerous
17 drafts exchanged between counsel for the Parties;
- 18 • Drafting and reviewing the Payment Letter to be sent to by the Settlement
19 Administrator to the Aggrieved Employees;
- 20 • Communicating with Plaintiffs who requested updates or other information
21 regarding this matter;
- 22 • Requesting bids from third-party settlement administrators for settlement
23 administration; and
- 24 • Preparing the Motion for Approval of PAGA Settlement and preparation and
25 attendance at the Motion for Approval of PAGA Settlement hearing.

26 25. Plaintiff's Counsel also bears the risk of taking whatever actions are necessary if
27 Defendants fail to pay. Thus, the Court should find that Plaintiff's Counsel's hours were necessary
28

1 and reasonable to achieve the excellent result. Plaintiff's Counsel's hourly rates are in line with,
2 and, in fact, modest, compared with the hourly rates of other counsel in similar actions.

3 26. And, the over 330 hours expended by the lawyers and staff members of Bibiyan
4 Law Group, P.C., in connection with this Action is only a calculation of efforts made thus far; it
5 does not include the time that will be spent preparing for and attending the approval hearing,
6 reviewing the Settlement Administrator's final calculations and subsequent coordination with the
7 Settlement Administrator to ensure payments to PAGA Members are timely distributed. Thus,
8 Plaintiff's Counsel requests that the Court find that these hours are reasonable in this litigation.

9 27. The courts are quite liberal in the evidence required to prove an attorney's hours.
10 Detailed time records are not required. An attorney's testimony alone may suffice.

11 28. Reasonable hours include, in addition to time spent during litigation, the time spent
12 before the action is filed, including time spent interviewing the clients, investigation of the facts
13 and the law, and preparing the initial pleadings.

14 29. Here, Plaintiff's Counsel has established by declaration testimony the over 330
15 hours spent in this case, which suffices for evidentiary purposes.

16 30. Plaintiff's Counsel has been representing Plaintiff for almost two years, while
17 never receiving any compensation, and expending significant time and resources which could have
18 been directed towards other cases. In agreeing to litigate this case on a contingent fee basis,
19 Plaintiff's Counsel assumed considerable risk given the uncertain outcome of PAGA actions.

20 31. Here, no multiplier is required as Plaintiffs' counsel incurred more than is being
21 requested.

22 **Plaintiff Would Have Been Entitled to a Multiplier Based on a Percentage of the Fund**
23 **to Ensure that the Fee Awarded is Within the Range of Fees Freely Negotiated**
24 **in the Legal Marketplace in Comparable Litigation**

25 32. Had it been necessary, a multiplier to reach the fees requested by Plaintiff's
26 Counsel is more than justified to compensate Plaintiff's Counsel at a rate reflecting the risk of
27 nonpayment in this matter, as Plaintiff's Counsel's representation of Plaintiff was purely on a
28 contingent basis. As set forth herein, the risk of nonpayment in this Action was particularly acute,

1 too. This is because litigating a PAGA representative action through trial takes years and requires
2 the investment of tens (if not hundreds) of thousands of dollars and thousands of hours of time.
3 Attorneys willing to undertake this risk deserve a high rate of recovery.

4 33. Moreover, wage-and-hour laws are still developing, and change in the law always
5 threaten to wipe out the plaintiff's attorney. In fact, numerous appellate decisions and decisions
6 of both the California and United States Supreme Courts have attacked the validity of PAGA
7 actions directly relevant to this case, which, as set forth herein, could have significantly affected
8 its value. It is this contingent nature of these cases that justify an award when and if PAGA
9 Counsel are able to obtain a settlement or verdict, because oftentimes no money is recovered in a
10 case, including plaintiff's counsel's costs, let alone their time.

11 **This Litigation Precluded Other Employment by Plaintiff's Counsel**

12 34. I believe a practitioner can only properly litigate so many cases at one time. The
13 requirements of this case were significant, requiring over 330 hours to be expended to date by
14 Plaintiff's Counsel, and another twenty-five (25) to fifty (50) hours conservatively expected to be
15 expended in the future in connection with approval, settlement administration, answering
16 questions of PAGA Members, and updates to this Court regarding uncashed checks. Plaintiff's
17 Counsel was also most definitely precluded from other employment. This factor must also be
18 considered.

19 **Costs Incurred by Plaintiff's Counsel**

20 35. The Settlement provides for reimbursement of Plaintiff's Counsel's litigation costs
21 in an amount up to \$30,000.00. Plaintiff's Counsel requests only \$26,363.83 in total for costs
22 incurred. An itemized list of the \$21,060.83 in costs incurred by Bibiyan Law Group is attached
23 as Exhibit 1.

24 I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of California that the foregoing
