**[PROPOSED] ORDER GRANTING
PLAINTIFF'S MOTION TO APPROVE
PAGA SETTLEMENT AND JUDGMENT**

1 Plaintiff MAHARI SMITH (“Plaintiff”) moves for approval of the settlement of Plaintiff’s
2 claims under the California Labor Code Private Attorneys General Act (“PAGA”), pursuant to
3 California Labor Code § 2699(s), against NORTH SACRAMENTO HEALTHCARE, LLC, *dba*
4 NORTH POINTE CARE CENTER (“Defendant”).

5 Plaintiff exhausted all administrative remedies required to bring the PAGA claims asserted
6 in this action and is authorized to act as a private attorney general with respect to the PAGA claims
7 being released under the terms of the PAGA Settlement Agreement (“Settlement Agreement”). The
8 California Labor Workforce Development Agency (“LWDA”) was provided with notice of the
9 settlement and the motion for approval of the settlement via its online process and no objection has
10 been received to the settlement or the motion from the LWDA. The Parties seek approval of the
11 settlement of Plaintiff’s PAGA claims and the Gross Settlement Amount to be paid as part of the
12 settlement as set forth in the Settlement Agreement, which was filed with the Court (“PAGA
13 Settlement”). The PAGA Settlement provides for a Gross Settlement Amount in the total sum of
14 \$310,000.00 which includes the Individual PAGA Payments, the LWDA PAGA Payment, the
15 PAGA Counsel Fees Payment of \$103,333.33, the PAGA Counsel Litigation Expenses Payment of
16 \$20,962.73, and Administration Expenses Payment of \$5,000.00. The Administrator will be Atticus
17 Administration, LLC. The Administrator shall transmit the funds represented by any settlement
18 checks not cashed within 180 days to the California Controller's Unclaimed Property Fund in the
19 name of the Aggrieved Employee. The Court approved the Gross Settlement Amount and the
20 distributions of the Gross Settlement Amount as set forth above.

21 The Court, having reviewed the evidence and papers submitted and argument of counsel,
22 pursuant to Labor Code section 2699(s)(2) hereby GRANTS the Parties’ motion and approves the
23 PAGA Settlement as set forth in the Settlement Agreement and the Gross Settlement Amount,
24 which shall be allocated and paid out as set forth in the Settlement Agreement. The “Aggrieved
25 Employees” are defined as all individuals who are or previously were employed by Defendant North
26 Sacramento Healthcare, LLC *dba* North Pointe Care Center in California and classified as non-
27 exempt employees at any time during the period from January 27, 2024 through February 9, 2026
28 ("PAGA Period").

1 Upon entry of final judgment and funding of the Gross Settlement Amount, the Defendant
2 shall be entitled to a release from the Plaintiff and the State of California for all PAGA claims
3 alleged in the operative complaint in the Action and Plaintiffs PAGA Notice to the LWDA which
4 occurred during the PAGA Period, including alleged violations of Labor Code sections 201, 201.3,
5 202, 203, 204, 210, 218.5, 218.6, 221, 226, 226.2, 226.3, 226.7, 227.3, 246, 510, 512, 558, 1174,
6 1174.5, 1194, 1197, 1197.1, 1197.14, 1198, 1198.5, 1199, 2699 et seq., 2802, and 2804, and the
7 applicable IWC Wage Orders, and expressly excluding all other claims, including claims for vested
8 benefits, wrongful termination, unemployment insurance, disability, social security, workers'
9 compensation, and PAGA claims outside of the PAGA Period.

10 Neither the Settlement Agreement nor the settlement contained therein, nor any act
11 performed or document executed pursuant to or in furtherance of the Settlement Agreement: (i) is
12 or may be deemed to be or may be used as an admission of, or evidence of, the validity of any
13 Released PAGA Claims; or (ii) is or may be deemed to be or may be used as an admission of, or
14 evidence of, any fault or omission by Defendant or any of the Released Parties in any civil, criminal,
15 or administrative proceeding in any court, administrative agency, or other tribunal. Defendant or
16 any of the Released Parties may file the Settlement Agreement and/or the separate Judgment from
17 this action in any other action that may be brought against it or them in order to support a defense
18 or counterclaim based on principles of *res judicata*, collateral estoppel, release, good faith
19 settlement, judgment bar or reduction or any theory of claim preclusion or issue preclusion or
20 similar defense or counterclaim.

21 Upon completion of administration of the Settlement, the Settlement Administrator will
22 provide written certification of such completion to the Court and counsel for the Parties which shall
23 be filed with the Court fifteen (15) court days before the non-appearance compliance hearing set
24 for _____ at _____ a.m., in Dept.8A.

25 Judgment is hereby entered on the claims in this action. After entry of this Order and
26 Judgment, the Court shall retain jurisdiction to construe, interpret, implement, and enforce the
27 Settlement Agreement, to hear and resolve any contested challenge to a claim for settlement
28

1 benefits, and to supervise and adjudicate any dispute arising from or in connection with the
2 distribution of settlement benefits.

3 **IT IS SO ORDERED AND ADJUDGED. LET JUDGMENT BE FORTHWITH**
